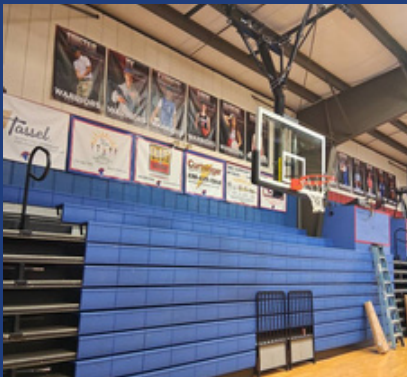
Protecting our Warrior Legacy
