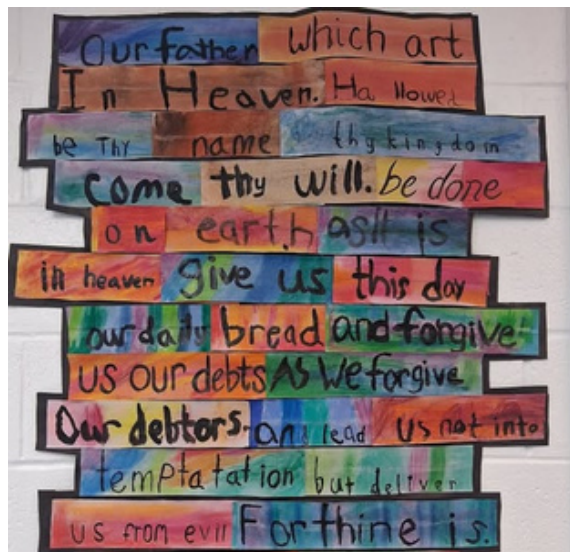
Protecting our Warrior Legacy

Julie Scott Emmons, class of '91, earned a BA in history and M.Ed. in Special Education before teaching in a K-12 classroom. Then, she moved into an instructor role at Elon University's School of Education. She is also the parent of an ACS alumnus (Jacob, class of '21)

Always interested in public service, she managed a successful Congressional campaign back in 2014, becoming Deputy Chief of Staff. Currently, she is the South Regional Director of Government Affairs for the Human Coalition - a non-profit that rescues children and families from abortion.
